Businesses with lactation support programs boast a post maternity retention rate of 94.2% compared to the national retention rate of 59%.¹

Increases Savings: Through decreased healthcare costs, decreased employee absenteeism, increase in employee retention, increase in employee morale and loyalty.

Businesses save \$3.00 for every \$1.00 spent on lactation support services.²

<u>WIC - Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children</u>: The nutrition program for pregnant, breastfeeding women, and families with children up to age 5. WIC services are available for income-qualifying families (a mother or child in a family of 4 with a gross annual income of up to \$47,638 would be eligible).

> WIC participants get healthy food, one-on-one counseling with nutritionists, recipes and cooking demos, nutrition classes, and breastfeeding support.
